

# Overdose Data to Action (OD2A): Grants to Prevent Opioid, Methamphetamine, and Polysubstance Overdose-related Deaths in Hawai'i through Innovative Projects

## Description

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The Hawai'i Health and Harm Reduction Center is accepting applications for grant year 2021-2022 (9/1/21-8/31/22) Grants to Prevent Opioid, Methamphetamine, and Polysubstance Overdose-related Deaths in Hawai'i. The purpose of this funding is to reduce the number of drug overdose deaths among Hawai'i residents by supporting local service organizations and other key community sectors to develop new projects, or enhance existing projects, that increase community education and access to resources around opioid, methamphetamine, and polysubstance use and overdose.

## Eligibility

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Eligible applicants are agencies within Hawai'i state who provide support services directly to people who use drugs (PWUD) in their community.
