The purpose of this program is to reduce the number of drug overdose deaths among Hawai'i residents by training local service organizations and other key community sectors on risk factors and harm reduction strategies for opioid, methamphetamine, and polysubstance use, including the use of naloxone to reverse opioid overdose and the appropriate course of action to address stimulant overdose; and implementing secondary prevention strategies, including the purchase and distribution of naloxone to participating programs for distribution directly to the communities they serve.
