## **HOW TO SPOT AN OD**

Taking too much of a drug (or a combination of drugs) can overwhelm the body. The main dangers of an overdose are **suffocation**, **heart failure** and **seizures**.

#### OVERDOSE OF **DEPRESSANTS** (DOWNERS)

Lips, fingertips, or skin turning blue or gray Breathing is slow, irregular, or has stopped Unresponsive to voice and touch

#### OVERDOSE OF **STIMULANTS** (UPPERS)

Extreme jumpiness, muscle twitches, tremors, seizures Pressure, tightness, or pain in the chest Increased heart rate, heart attack Hallucinations, delirium, confusion Throwing up or foaming at the mouth Coordination loss, collapsing/fainting from exhaustion
